THE THEME

'Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me.' We've all heard someone say this at one time or other - we may have said it ourselves, but how true resources visit the SCN pages on our website. is it? Anti-bullying week 2011 is focussed on tackling verbal bullying, with the slogan 'Stop and think - words can hurt'. Young people at the ABA Youth Summit 2010 said name-calling and offensive language is a serious concern in schools, the community, and in cyberspace. This year we ask children and young people to stop and think about the things they say, and the words they use - whether face to face or through the internet. This includes the use of words and phrases that are homophobic, sexist, racist or hurtful to children with special educational needs and disabilities.

Stand Tall: A Rock Musical is a modern reworking of the story of David and Goliath - gone is the sling - to be replaced with an electric guitar! The musical has a strong anti-bullying theme - that will appeal to both primary and secondary school age children. Entry to the competition is simple - we have provided a short powerpoint presentation that can be used in an assembly or in class time to get students thinking about Anti-Bullying Week 2011, and to introduce 3 songs from the show. Students vote for the song they think best gets an anti-bullying message across. You then submit your song choice through our website to be entered into the prize draw.
