TRAVEL INFORMATION

CLEY CHURCH is off the A149 coast road in Cley village (behind The Three Swallows).

NORFOLK WILDLIFE TRUST Visitors Centre and land straddles the A149. Walking distance between Cley church and the centre is about a mile.

The Coasthopper bus goes through Cley every half hour. Its route is from Cromer to Kings Lynn and it links with trains from Norwich at Sheringham. It travels less frequently between Holt and Cley. For details see www.coasthopper.co.uk
