PRIDE 5 FESTIVAL

A five day festival to celebrate five years of Pride. There will be stalls, talks, displays and the Pride Shop in the Forum all week as well as Pride Art School at the Pride without Prejudice exhibition and events across the city. The Pride 5 Festival is funded with a grant from the Norfolk Community Fund and aims to give more people than ever before a chance to engage in the Pride celebrations.

PRIDE HOUSE

Central to this year's celebrations is the Pride House – an installation of art and photography in the Atrium of the Forum celebrating the history of Norwich Pride. With comfy sofas to relax in and tables to work on, the Pride House will be an inspirational meeting place.

FLYING THE FLAG

The rainbow flag will be flying on buildings all over Norwich including City Hall, County Hall, the Castle Museum, City College, Norfolk and Norwich Hospital, Hellesdon Hospital, Norfolk Fire and Rescue. Aviva Jarrolds and Norwich Puppet Theatre. It is the most visual way an organisation can show that it celebrates diversity and values its LGBT citizens, customers, students and staff. The Pride Parade is the emotional highpoint of the day and not to be missed. This year it is guaranteed to be the biggest and the brightest yet as we've got Exeter Pride's 50 metre long Rainbow Flag and there's a competition for best costumes. David Bullock. the Norwich Town Crier and Councillor Keith Driver, the Lord Mayor of Norwich, will launch the Parade and then wave to us from City Hall which will be bedecked in the Pride Scarf. We'll be led by the Norwich Samba Band and their dancers and vou'll also find the Dun Dun Band, Musica de Brazil and club music from The Loft NR1

3-5PM PRIDE SHOW

This year we are delighted to bring you the Pride Show on the Wigwam Stage! It will look and sound fantastic on Millennium Plain outside the Forum and will provide the perfect showcase for some brilliant acts. We are thrilled that Ms Special K and Ms Krystal de Kanta are reforming the Killer Queens for one day only to host the show and that Raevennan Husbandes, winner of Future Radio's "Next Big Thing," will be performing. We've also got boy band Class A, Swedish singer Jan George, classical cross-over artist Jaden Cornelius. ACCESS AT NORWICH PRIDE

Norwich Pride is for everyone and we welcome people of all ages and abilities. We aim to make each year's Pride more accessible and inclusive than the last. This year we have an Access Officer, Dean Simons, who has set up the Norwich Pride Access Group to consult with Pride-goers with access needs. Plans include:

- Specially trained access stewards in pink jackets
- Space at the front of the parade for disabled people and their supporters who would like to march together
- Enclosed Access Area for the Pride Show
- Help Desk at the Forum with information about venues, parking, accessible toilets etc
- British Sign Language (BSL) interpreters
- Loop system in the Curve
- Quiet rest area with comfortable seats on 2nd floor of library (please use lift at the back of library)
- Facebook and Twitter feed to follow the action at home
- Large print brochure available




