The autumn term and harvest time is the perfect time to do a project about locally produced food - perhaps with a themed assembly or as part of the science, geography, DT, PSHE, or history curriculum.

You could invite a local farmer or food producer into school, visit a working farm or a farm shop, find out about Norfolk foods stocked in your local supermarket or find out about how farmers grow crops.

Don't forget food from water: sea, lake and river, or local drinks.

There are plenty of resources available: lots of food producers in Norfolk, food based events in and around Norfolk in September and October and several websites, both local and national, with teaching ideas and resources. See some suggestions on the back of this leaflet.

Complete the project by creating local food maps and enter the FACE competition

THE PRIZE (Sponsored by the Clan Trust) will be on a local food theme.

The exact prize will be decided with the winning school, for example it could be a local food celebration day for the class that produced the winning entry (perhaps a visit to a working farm or visit to school by a local chef) or the whole school could benefit with maybe fruit and vegetable plants and seeds for the school garden.

The Competition

Maps can be created in any medium and be 3D or flat—the maximum size is A3 and they will need to survive the post unless you decide to deliver them yourself! They can incorporate text and illustrations - the aim is to show what the children have learnt about some of the foods produced in Norfolk in as attractive and interesting way as possible. Entries are limited to 2 maps per class in the school so why not get all the children to produce maps as part of the project and select entries to be sent for the competition?

Judging

The judges will all be connected with Norfolk food growing in some way and will be looking for not only an imaginative way of creating the map and interesting and entertaining content but also for evidence of how much the children have learned about the food produced in the area.

Judging will take place in November and the winner informed in December – the prize, which will be agreed with the school to help meet their needs, will 'happen' during the Spring Term 2014. We hope to get press coverage of the prize winner.

Competition rules

- 1 Maps can be in any medium the maximum size is A3.
- 2 The competition is open to any school in Norfolk with children up to year 6 Entries are limited to two maps per class in the school - if more maps than this are submitted they will not be included in the judging.
- 3 The maps must be original work by the children.
- 4 The maps will not be returned (unless a special arrangement is made) and they may be included in future displays and promotions
- 5 On the back of the map please put:
 - The name, address and telephone number of the school
 - The teacheri/c of the entries
 - The year group, class name and names of the child (ren) who have made the map.
- 6 The age of the children who have created the map will be taken into consideration by the judges whose decision is final.
- 7 The closing date for the competition entries to be received at the address below is **Monday 28th October 2013**.
