There will be more than £6bn of EU Structural Funds available to the UK from 2014 to 2020. These funds (ERDF, ESF, EAFRD) and their various strands (including Interreg) have provided millions of pounds to the arts, culture and creative industries since 2000. But not everyone understands the opportunities these new funds provide, or the ways the arts, culture and creative industries can deliver the desired outcomes, or the practical steps involved in understanding the calls and the application procedures.

On 30 October at the Southbank Centre in London, Euclid presents a unique conference which brings together the key players – the UK government departments responsible for these funds; the Local Enterprise Partnerships (LEPs) and other agencies who will allocate these funds at the local level; the relevant creative industries and arts & culture agencies, and examples of successful projects that have benefitted from these funds in the past.

If you are in the arts, culture or creative industries, you will learn about these opportunities and how you can apply. The British Film Institute (BFI) is inviting applications to its Programming Development Fund, which seeks to enhance audience choice by enabling exhibitors to back more adventurous programming. The Programming Development Fund forms part of the BFI Audience Fund 2013-2017. The Programming Development Fund will support programming initiatives of cultural significance, high profile and wide reach, encouraging curatorial ambition, achieving economies of scale and bringing films to audiences across the UK in a fresh and original way. The fund aims to achieve this through supporting comprehensive programmes of activity led by exhibitors.

Up to £1.4 million per year will be available through the Programming Development Fund over the four years to 2017. Properly constituted organisations are eligible to apply. These include limited liability companies, community interest companies, charities or trusts, local authorities or statutory bodies. Applicants and/or their partners should have direct experience of film exhibition and audience development activity within the UK, such as cinemas, cinema chains or consortia, film festivals or arts organisations with experience of film curation.

Esmée Fairbairn Collections Fund (UK)

Esmée Fairbairn has announced a new three year programme of support (2013-2016) for the Esmée Fairbairn Collections Fund. The Fund aims to broaden access to, and use of, museum collections and focuses on time-limited collections work outside the scope of an organisation's core resources.

The Fund will be increased from £800,000 to £1,000,000 per year in recognition of the strong demand and high number of good applications over the last three years. Between 2011 and 2013, the fund has administered grants to a value of £2.4m (£1.6m has already been awarded, £400,000 will be awarded in June 2013, and a further £400,000 will be awarded in November 2013.

Eligible applications include research into collections, conservation, collections review and initiatives to develop the use of collections.

Each grant is within the range of £20,000-£100,000.

The latest round of funding allocations has just been announced, including a grant of £53,000 to Glenside Hospital Museum to research items from Beaufort War Hospital, and £65,000 to the Harris Museum and Art Gallery for a project to relate the museum's coin collection to contemporary audiences. Grantees are expected to join an MA run network which encourages shared learning and training.

The Theatre's Trust small capital grants

The Woodward Charitable Trust has eight funding priorities:

- Children and young people who are isolated, at risk of exclusion or involved in anti-social behaviour
- Minority groups including refugees, gypsies and travellers. Projects that promote integration and community cohesion will be favoured
- Projects that help the rehabilitation and resettlement of prisoners and/or ex-offenders are supported as well as requests to helps prisoners families

- Disability projects which can include rehabilitation and training for people who are either physically disabled or learning disabled, as well as help to improve employment prospects
- Homelessness, especially affecting young people and women, and covering facilities such as women's refuges
- Arts outreach work by local groups for the benefit of disadvantaged people
- Environmental projects, especially with a strong educational element

There are three types of grants:

- Small grants of £100-£5,000
- Large grants of over £5,000 (these are rare and are usually initiated via the trustees directly)
- Children's summer play scheme grants £500-£1,000

Funding is generally for one-off projects and will favour small-scale, locally based initiatives.

Trustees will not fund charities with an annual turnover of more than £250,000.

Grants applications are reviewed twice a year, usually in January and July, with deadlines two months before.
