Comic Relief UK Grants Programme Re-opens for Applications (UK)

Following a strategic review of its funding, Comic Relief has announced that its new UK grant making programme is now open for applications. Through its new UK Main Fund, Comic Relief will provide funding for activities that tackle complex problems and create positive social change across the UK. To be eligible for funding projects must address at least of five themes. These are:

- **BETTER FUTURES**: This theme focuses on supporting young people who have limited opportunities and face significant challenges. This could be because of where they live, family experience, poor mental health, teenage pregnancy, caring responsibilities, homelessness or drug and alcohol use.
- **SAFER LIVES**: This theme aims to support people who face violence, abuse and exploitation. Comic Relief predominantly fund work with those aged 11 and upwards. There is no upper age limit.
- **HEALTHIER FINANCES**: This theme aims to support those in severe financial hardship.
- STRONGER COMMUNITIES: Under this theme, we'll make small grants to locally-based groups or organisations in areas of disadvantage that have a clear understanding of the needs of their community and are working to address them. All applications are managed through the UK Community Foundation. - **FAIRER SOCIETY**: This theme aims to empower and give a voice to marginalised groups of people, so that they can challenge injustice and bring about positive changes for those who face discrimination and stigma.

The funding will be available to registered charities and other not for profit organisations that operate England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man. Active Communities Programme Opens for Applications (England & Scotland)

The People's Health Trust has announced that local groups and organisations with great ideas to make their communities better places to live are now invited to apply for funding to turn their ideas into reality. The People's Health Trust has opened its Active Communities programme in 3 areas across Britain. Active Communities is a funding programme for community groups and not-for-profit organisations, with an income of less than £350,000 a year, that are seeking investment of between £5,000 and £50,000 for projects lasting up to two years. The projects should take place within a small area for a small group of people such as 20 or 30 streets or a couple of villages. Funding for Artists & Bands (England)

PRS for Music Foundation and Arts Council England have announced the launch of the Momentum Music Fund. This is a £500,000 fund to develop the careers of talented artists and bands. It is anticipated that grants of between £5,000 and £15,000 will be awarded to between 50 and 75 artists/bands over the next 2 years. Applications can be submitted by the artists themselves or those who are working on their behalf, e.g. a manager, an independent label or publisher. Priority will be given to those that haven't been funded by PRS for Music Foundation in the previous 12 months. The next application deadline is the 11th October 2013. The Artists' international development programme is a £750,000 fund, jointly funded by the British Council and Arts Council England. Causeway Youth Exchanges & Advance Planning Grants (UK)

Causeway, the British – Irish Youth Exchange programme has announced that grants of up to £450 are available for British groups of young people aged 13-25 years and their youth workers/leaders to participate in exchanges with their Irish counterparts. The grants are available for both sending and hosting young people. In addition youth workers / leaders have the opportunity to apply for Advanced Planning Visit grants which allows youth workers/ leaders to visit the partner group where the exchange will take place. Funding to Enable Disadvantaged Young People Reach their Potential (UK)

Registered charities that work with disadvantaged children under the age of 25 can apply for funding of up to £10,000 through the Ironmongers Company's grants programme. In particular the company wants to support projects that provide opportunities for disadvantaged children and young people to fulfil their potential and educational activities that develop learning, motivation and skills. Projects could, for example, support special educational needs, address behavioural problems or promote citizenship, parenting or life skills. Preference will be given to projects piloting new approaches where the outcomes will be disseminated to a wider audience. Although the grants are available within the UK preference is given to projects in inner London. BBC Children in Need - Main Grants Programme (UK)

BBC Children in Need has announced that the next applications deadline for its Main Grants Programme is the 15th September 2013. Funding is available to organisations that work with young people who are suffering from:

- Have behavioural or psychological difficulties 0r

- · Are living in poverty or situations of deprivation.
- The Main grants programme is open to applications for over £10,000.

Examples of projects that recently received funding include:

- The Oasis Academy Lord's Hill Southampton which received a grant of £19,467 for a project that will work with 5-11 year olds who have poor school attendance and behaviour issues. Through drama and dance workshops they hope to increase their self-esteem, communication and team working skills.
- · Cirque du Ciel, in Penzance which received a grant of £16,226 to provide circus skills workshops in order to improve the communication, coordination, social skills, concentration, and self-esteem of disadvantaged children in West Cornwall.

BBC Children in Need also work with the Frank Buttle Trust to provide support through the Emergency Essentials programme. This programme supports individual children and young people living with severe poverty, that suffer from a lack of the basic facilities which most of us take for granted and face additional pressures such as domestic violence, disability or poor health in the family.
