
A Flock of Ideas

Using a visit to a flock of sheep as a basis for learning within the primary curriculum

Visits at lambing time are popular but school visits to flocks of sheep at any time of the year can provide a range of learning opportunities linked to the primary curriculum.

The programme at Mayfields Farm will include outdoor sessions with sheep and sheep dogs as well as practical and hands on sessions exploring learning opportunities for literacy, maths, science, history, pshe and crafts



Mayfields Farm is a 40 acre smallholding on the edge of Themelthorpe village, in the parish of Foulsham, near Reepham in Norfolk. It is owned by the Countryside Restoration Trust, a conservation charity, which aims to protect and restore Britain's countryside with wildlife friendly, sustainable agriculture and community involvement.


