Title: Challenging Homophobic Language assembly

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Age of children/young people: Y7 – Y11 (Assemblies were by year group)

Brief Description of Challenging Homophobia work:

The assembly (Acle High have been responsible for designing the assembly that we are sharing with Norfolk high schools to use to challenge homophobia and homophobic language) gave key definitions to ensure that students understood what was meant by homophobia and homophobic language. Clear messages were given as to the harm that such language causes to individuals and the potential consequences for students who use homophobic terms – whether they intend to cause harm or otherwise. Students were the voices quoting personal statements from "Stonewall" reinforcing the display of key statistics.

Case Study There was a deep silence at the end of each assembly - it appeared to hit home. Staff commented positively on the clarity of messages given.
Although, there was a spike in the reporting of homophobic comments made in the couple of weeks after the assemblies. Anecdotally, there appears to be far less use of "gay" or other homophobic terms as an insult by students around school and an increased awareness that use of such language is harmful.
