### Your area's Great War

As you'll no doubt be aware, First World War commemorations are upon us. If your school would like to study the impact of the War on your local area, then this event could be for you!

On **Tuesday**, **25 March 2014**, Norfolk Record Office will be teaming up with the Norfolk School Library Service to run a twilight workshop for staff called 'World War One in Your Family Story'. The session will run from 4-6pm and take place in the SLS Training Room at County Hall (cost: one SLS token).

By the end of the session we hope you will have the skills to help pupils search for sources about people local to you who fought, and those who remained behind. We also hope you will leave with ideas to link your First World War project across geography, art, music and literacy.




### The Pastons and the Pursuit of Power

In December and January, we welcomed Bawburgh and Aldborough Primaries to workshops based around our exhibition about the Paston family and their influence in Norfolk and beyond (images throughout).

We worked in partnership with the Paston Heritage Society who provided activities during the workshops from calligraphy to costume and from consulting 'wise woman' Mother Agnes to playing medieval games. Pupils also visited our strongrooms (which were 'awesome humungous cool'!) and completed our exhibition trail.

Look out for activities and competitions coinciding with new exhibitions later this year – from May we'll be celebrating St Benet's Abbey and the Broads, and from August, Norfolk in the First World War.



### Downloadable resources

Did you know that our website contains downloadable resources for you to use in the classroom? Here are a couple of those available for KS2:

- ♦ 'What was the impact of the Second Air Division in East Anglia during the Second World War?' This pack is perfect for those of you close to WWII American Airfields − it looks at aeroplanes, missions, and cultural differences between the Americans and local people. This pack can be enhanced with a CD filled with remembrances from the Norfolk Sound Archive.
- 'Are we still in England?' This resource considers the impact of the Second World War on children, including evacuees, and uses letters, photographs and memoirs from children living through the conflict.
