

EAL Admissions and SEN

Course Outline

This course will support delegates to ensure best practice for EAL pupils and their families in two key areas. In part one we look at the advantages that conducting a thorough Admissions meeting can bring. In addition, in part two, we will cover how to distinguish between EAL and SEN issues and will demonstrate the use of an effective assessment pack which can be used to screen for SpLD in EAL pupils.

Morning - EAL Admissions

- An outline of what makes a good Admissions meeting
- Information for interpretation and translation. Guidance on when to use which method, using INTRAN and Language Line (face to face and telephone) with parents and children
- An EAL template to ensure all essential information about a new EAL arrivals is recorded and disseminated
- Updated information on EAL funding
- A template EAL register which includes all relevant information and is a useful working document
- Tips and strategies for ways to ensure the most effective induction and initial teaching strategies
- Methods to ensure that the school environment is culturally responsive and ensures wellbeing for all
- EAL frameworks for monitoring progress and setting appropriate EAL targets
- Methods for undertaking a first language assessment and understanding of the importance of doing this

Afternoon - SEN

- Exploring the dilemmas EAL / SEN
- Time frames, documentation and a little theory!
- An opportunity to explore assessment packs which can be useful in helping to diagnose SEN difficulties in EAL pupils including the CAMYL assessment pack, which provides SpLD screening for EAL pupils providing an initial diagnosis and evidence to take forward.
