Booking for Dippy - what you need to know!

Many of you will recall the heart thumping excitement that used to hit us when we viewed Dippy for the first time when he was in the great hall at the National History Museum in London and we're sure that seeing him in the Nave of Norwich Cathedral will be equally as dynamic! A huge number of schools and academies will want to come and see him so in order to give as many as possible the opportunity, there will be timed, short sessions.

- <u>It's FREE</u> but all school visits to Dippy <u>must be booked in</u> <u>advance</u> - no school will be allowed in un-booked.
- Our booking line opens very soon, <u>1st October 2019.</u> Just email Debbie on *schoolsadmin@cathedral.org.uk* to request your preferred date between 13th-21st July & 7th Sept– 21st Oct 2020 and book your FREE 30 minute timed slots.
- In 2020 you will receive a Dippy pack about what to do on the day of your visit plus all essential information.
- On the day, all classes will receive a short intro when they enter the nave, there will then be time to view Dippy and drop off at our craft activity tables before departing.
- We regret that you will not be able to stay on to self-guide in the Cathedral after you have seen Dippy due to the volume of visitors each day. Other venues in the city will likely be hosting special Dippy related activities, so keep an eye on their websites to see what's on offer.
