



Ready to Go! Achievement Badge Design Competition

TITAN launched the new Ready To Go! framework and supporting materials for secondary schools, colleges and post 16 providers during March 2021. Services are targeted at young people with EHCP/SEND needs supporting them to travel independently to their post 16 educational establishment, as part of their transition to adulthood.

This competition allows colleagues supporting the TITAN client group to get involved in an exciting new aspect of the TITAN programme.

Your school's mission – the design of achievement badges for the TITAN Ready To Go! programme

Our new look travel independence training programme, Ready To Go! has just been launched to Norfolk secondary schools, colleges and post 16 training providers. We are looking for your students help with the design, theme and styling of a set of achievement badges. This is an important part of the programme in recognising student progress through the Ready to Go! programme.

Digital achievement badges will form part of the new TITAN passport, requested by post 16 providers allowing them to see, at a glance, the travel independence skills of a student transitioning to post 16 provision.

Under the Ready to Go! framework there are **6 main skills** to achieve to become a successful independent traveller:

- Pedestrian Skills
- Communication Skills
- Personal Safety

- Health and Well Being
- Problem Solving
- Journey Planning and Journey Practice

Each of these skills are achieved at 3 levels: Red, Amber and Green.

We are looking for students to help create a set of digital badges that will be awarded once a skill has been achieved. The badges will be used by educational establishments across Norfolk as they recognise and reward students' progress on the Ready to Go! programme.

Your students can contribute to the design of badges in a number of ways, for example:

- Design at least one badge from any of the modules and levels. This could be done in small groups or individuals could design their own badge. Students can design more than one badge if they wish.
- Choose a skill i.e. Pedestrian Skills and design three badges, one for each level: Red (introducing), Amber (emerging) and Green (independent). Discuss with students their ideas for a theme or design for the journey badges, which we can then turn into reality, this could be note provided by the teacher, a video describing their suggestions and /or ideas that are fully formed.

Format – your choice!

You can provide students designs in the format that suits you and your students the best, for example:

- you could create a short video which explains your ideas
- take some photographs
- do some artwork
- record a discussion which explains the student/s ideas

Important stuff to remember!

Your images/ideas will need to be:





- creative
- colourful
- themed
- relatable to the new TITAN modules and the progress through red, amber, green
- can include up to 3 short words
- original and copyright-free


These are just some examples of the format of what the journey badges might look like.
