VSSS family days at Gressenhall

Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse Museum provides a wonderful setting for the VSSS family days, the staff are always friendly and supportive. The Key Stage 2 day at Gressenhall was a great success, we were joined by 18 families, and everyone enjoyed taking part in the river dipping, dissecting owl pellets alongside the familiar favourites of the tractor ride, watching the animals and of course the fabulous adventure play area.

There was also another very enjoyable day at Gressenhall for preschool and KS1 deaf, multisensory impaired, VI children and their families on Monday 5th September. 33 families came, involving 140 adults and children. Families and children enjoyed the variety of activities – the museum, the adventure playground, tractor rides and activities at the farm. A particular highlight this year was the Bear Ear Clinic (organised kindly by Toy Like Me) which had previously successfully attended the Norfolk Deaf Festival in July 2022. Children brought their teddies and cuddly toys to have a hearing aid fitting at the Bear Ear clinic – the toy hearing aids were a variety of colours and types and all free. There were signed stories of the book 'Bears Can Ski' which is related to the Bear Ear clinic. Toy Like Me also organised tactile activities for the event. Thank you to Gressenhall and Toy Like Me who supported the event so well.

Some comments from families:

"Thank you for a lovely day at Gressenhall yesterday! We loved it and glad we did the Bear Clinic early O always loves the little cottage! Here are some pics including of her cat with hearing aids- they are so good and have literally been tried on every single toy she possesses! I wish Toy Like Me would sell them as I'd buy in all the sizes" "It was an amazing day out. Days like this are so important for deaf families because the kids can play with each other, see that they are not alone, not the only ones wearing hearing aids or cochlear implants, also a great opportunity to meet other families and parents and talk about your journey, your difficulties, be more confident and see your kids being super confident as well! My daughter had an amazing day meeting other kids wearing cochlears or hearing aids and she was proud and happy as well! We enjoyed the bears clinic and the book reading and all the activities as well! Thanks so much for arranging such a wonderful day for all of us!"



Free bus pass

Did you know that any child or young person with a vision impairment (CYPVI) can apply for a bus pass, which allows them to travel for free at any time on any bus in Norfolk (except for Park and Ride buses)?

CYPVI who are 12 years old or over, are also entitled to have a companion enhancement, which will allow one companion to travel for free with them. A companion can be anyone (a carer, friend, relative etc) of bus fare paying age, who can support the CYPVI on the bus.

Anytime travel

CYPVI can travel with their bus pass at any time of the day in Norfolk, without the usual off-peak restrictions of a standard disabled pass. The pass will have a clock face at the top, indicating you can travel at any time so this will be clear to the bus drivers.

Companion enhancement

The bus pass will have a C in the top right-hand corner to show the driver that the CYPVI has a companion enhancement.

How to apply for a free bus pass

You can use the link below to apply for a bus pass online and clicking on "Apply for new disabled pass". You will need a photograph of the CYPVI along with supporting documentation as detailed on the website.

When applying online, there is no option to request a companion enhancement, so you will need to request it separately (it is not issued automatically). Once you have submitted your application online, you will receive confirmation and an Application ID number. You should then send an email requesting companion enhancement with your Application ID number to:

If you would prefer to complete a paper application form, you can print one from the NCC website. The "tick box" in section E will need to be checked for the companion enhancement to be added.

I already have a bus pass but no companion enhancement

If the bus pass does not have a C in the top right corner, you do not yet have companion enhancements but can request it by sending an email (with the name and date of birth of the CYPVI) to:

Park and Ride buses

The bus pass can be used on park and ride buses at a discounted rate rather than free like normal buses. Pass holders are entitled to a discounted rate of \pounds 1.80 return on park and ride services in Norfolk after 9.30am and \pounds 1.50 after 12 midday.
