# Parental responsibility measures attendance census 2022/23 Webcast and Q&A





#### What is the PRMA Census?

The data collection for attendance penalty notices (PNs), parenting contracts, parenting orders and attendance case management is an annual collection.

All LAs are asked to make this data return reporting on the provisions relating to the use of attendance penalty notices, attendance case management (fast track), parenting contracts, parenting orders and education supervision orders used within its authority during each academic year.

The data collection covers the school year from 1 September 2022 to 31 August 2023.







#### What do we need from you?

The census asks us several questions relating to Attendance case management, commonly referred to here in Norfolk as Fast Track. As this is a school led intervention, we do not hold the data required to complete the return and therefore need to collect it from you.

We must provide figures for the following questions:

- Total number of cases entering Fast Track during the period
- Total number of Fast Track cases prosecuted during the period
- Total number of Fast Track cases withdrawn, before prosecution, during the period

They also require the reason for withdrawal broken down by the following:

- Total number of Fast Track cases withdrawn because attendance improved following the support measures
- Total number of Fast Track cases withdrawn for another reason\*

\*We are then required to specify the reason for those cases withdrawn for another reason

## How will we collect this data from you?

We collect this data from you by using an MS form, it has been designed to capture the number of parenting contracts offered via Fast Track and does not collect personal information of pupils or parents.

### Things to remember when completing the return

- We ask that <u>all</u> schools complete the return even if they have not completed any Fast Track intervention this past academic year
- It is possible to complete one submission for multiple schools if you wish remember to state which schools it is in relation too
- You must count the number of <u>parents</u> who have been subject to invention via Fast Track for the total number of cases entered
- Each parent will have an outcome! So, if you have 10 parents entered you will have 10 outcomes accounted for on the form
- Deadline for submission is Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2023
