Outline

This twilight session will be delivered by the Norfolk Music Service which operates to promote high quality music education across Norfolk schools both in the curriculum and through instrumental and vocal teaching.

The session will explore how the use of sound and music can promote musical development but also support language development, imagination, social skills and emotional regulation, particularly for those with SEND.
