



ENGLISH HERITAGE LEARNERS GO FREE

Castle Acre Priory is one of the best-preserved and beautifully decorated monastic sites in England. The 11th century ruins are in a tranquil setting (with large undercover education space) ideal for local and creative studies as well as learning about medieval times and the impact of the Dissolution of the monasteries. Explore the history and geography of rural England, combining your visit with a look round the village's bailey gate and castle remains.



Elsewhere in Norfolk, visit Grimes Graves, the only prehistoric flint mine open to visitors in Britain and learn about the impact humans have had on the landscape for thousands of years. Or you could discover what life was like in the tenement or 'Row Houses' of Great Yarmouth where two of these houses show what these dwellings looked like at different stages in their history.
