

## **Anti-Bullying Shows/Workshops**

We just wanted to let you know what we are doing in and around Anti-Bullying Week this year.

As we do every year, we have an exciting show, with highly interactive and integrated workshop sections. This year's show is based on Lewis Carroll's 'Alice in Wonderland'. 'Trouble in Wonderland' follows Alice as she tries to help various characters with their bullying problems. With the help of the students in the audience, Alice tries to stop the evil Queen of Hearts. Through the interactive workshop sections, we can demonstrate that 'Taking Action Together' can really work and benefit everyone.

So far we are booked into 7 schools in Cambridgeshire (all repeat bookings from last year, and 5 of these we have been to every year since we started touring), but we have just done our big push for this event and so are looking to book many more.

We are also performing a Secondary bullying show in Comberton Village College for the second year in a row. This is a different, more mature show for the older audience, with hour long follow up workshops to focus more on the specific areas of bullying and ways to deal with it/stop it from starting in the first place.

We are also still performing the Anti-Bullying Show we wrote for last years Anti-Bullying Week, 'Cyber Attacks!'. Cyber bullying seems to still be such a huge issue, so we now offer this show all year round to support the work schools dedicate to this subject.
