Course Context/Audience:

This **new** course aims to support those embarking on teaching religious education in secondary schools, providing opportunities to discuss issues relating to subject knowledge and approaches to teaching and learning. The focus will be on the teaching of Christianity, as this was highlighted by the Ofsted 2010 report 'Transforming religious education' as an area requiring development in all schools. The day will provide plenty of workshop style activities, opportunity for interaction and development of materials to take back to school and use in the classroom. The day is led by Kathryn Wright and she will be supported by two experienced teachers of religious education.

Objectives:

By the end of the day you will be able to:

- Apply the principles of concept cracking to Christian beliefs such as reconciliation, the Trinity and sacrifice
- Use a range of creative learning opportunities to enable students to engage with Christian theological ideas
- Have confidence in using Christian concepts to explore philosophical and moral questions relating to destiny and vulnerability
