Does your school use the "Catch Up" reading recovery programme?

Our Catch Up collections are an ideal way of enriching your school based Catch Up reading resources. As well as up-to-date reading scheme materials our Catch Up titles include lots of exciting picture books and easy non-fiction books that cover Catch Up levels 3-12.

Catch Up collections are borrowed on a termly

basis. Each collection consists of 20 books at different levels of your choice. Collections can be exchanged once during the term at no extra cost allowing you to access 40 different titles during the term.

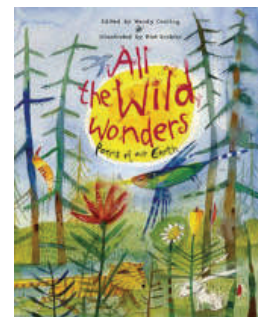
Best Books

Jeannie Baker's "Mirror" (9781406309140) is a beautiful and highly original wordless mirrored story of two cultures, Australia and Morocco. Inspired when the author travelled in Morocco, we see how the lives of two families are very different but inextricably linked. Add this to your library after your diversity audit!



We really like this new poetry book, **"All the Wild Wonders – poems of our earth"** edited by Wendy Cooling. More than 30 poems celebrate our earth and encourage

children to ask questions. The delicate illustrations from Piet Grobler perfectly reflect the fragile beauty of the world.
