Making Personal Education Plans a priority for children in care

All children and young people in care need to have a Personal Education Plan (PEP). The PEP brings together their care and education information in one document, so that all those working with a child know the essential information about their education.

Norfolk Children's Services has devised a new format for the PEP and this half-day workshop aims to take a detailed look at the document with advice and information on how to complete it. There will be opportunities for discussion and feedback for practitioners to promote interdisciplinary understanding and collaboration, and to ensure the success of the PEP process.

The PEP process allows all the adults planning a child's life to communicate with each other about that child's emotional future. During this training session time will be spent exploring the process and the necessity of investing in it. In particular the programme will highlight how multi-agency working can improve the educational opportunities for children in our care.

Training aims: To a) increase awareness and understanding of how to advocate for children and young people through the PEP process; b) enable them to access the appropriate support and opportunities in education, c) achieve their potential.

Target Group: A multi-agency training opportunity for social workers, designated teachers, residential staff, foster carers and Independent Reviewing Officers.
