High Quality Physical Education Chartermark Award

This Update recognises and celebrates the success of a further 9 primary schools across Norfolk who have achieved the High Quality PE Chartermark Award. This brings the total number in Norfolk to 36 with several schools deferring to the July application round.

Celebrating the *quality* of the provision made by schools for PE is something that Norfolk is committed to and so it would seem are others. Some local authorities are copying our lead and introducing the Award. Blackburn and Darwin, leading a consortia of other small local authorities have adopted our Chartermark Award.

The PE Chartermark Award goes beyond the collation of simple numeric data and establishes what the quality of teaching and learning, the curriculum and pupil achievement is like through a portfolio of evidence. This helps us to consider the quality of leadership and management of the subject as well as its overall effectiveness.
