## Targeted support to help you sustain PE and sport for Small Schools

With the national withdrawal of funding for PE and sport it is important that we look to find new ways to sustain and develop high quality PE and school sport. We are delighted to inform you that as part of our strategic response we have been able to secure funding to help small schools in Norfolk access our highly successful NPETCS programme for training TA's to plan and deliver high quality PE. This would potentially provide you with a specialist PE teacher who is embedded in your school – to cover PPA (reducing reliance on costly outside agencies) or to raise standards in physical education and sport across the whole school.

If you are a school which has not previously put forward a teaching assistant for this programme we are able to offer you the full programme with 60% of the costs covered. This would mean that the £400 remaining could be spread over the two financial years. If your school has an appropriate TA to put forward, we are sure that you will see this as a huge opportunity to access a proven programme – investing now to save in the longer-term. TA's trained on the Norfolk PE Teaching Competence Standards (NPETCS) programme are making a huge impact in schools across the county and in fact 85% of all schools who have achieved the High Quality PE Chartermark Award have been driven by candidates from the programme.

The benefit to you as a school of having a highly trained and competent TA, who is enthusiastic and passionate about PE and sport is obvious. We also find that these specialist TA's run after school clubs, events and fixtures – some are now starting to organise cluster / area sports. In the long-term this will give you the ability to develop and sustain a programme of lunch-time, after school clubs and fixtures with your specialist TA making links with community clubs, coaches and other stakeholders to enhance the quality and experience that your pupils receive. If you do not have a suitable candidate at this stage do also consider that there are a significant number of these specialist TA's already in schools and through your cluster it may be possible that schools can work collaboratively to share access to these specialists to enhance the PE experience for your pupils. Contact us to discuss your needs and so that we can sign-post you to schools in your immediate area, who could help, as we are happy to try and broker this level of local support.

A brand new NPETCS course for small schools is being planned to begin in April with a "mentors" session (half-day) in March. The subsidised cost will be £400 only and this cost can be spread over the two financial years (2010/11 and 20011/12) to help budget planning. Past candidates who work in small schools, teach vertical groups, operate out of village halls etc. will form an integral part of the new course – sharing and disseminating best practice and proven practice. The course will also be accredited at Level 3 with the National Open College

Network. This will make it both unique and highly applicable to your school settings.
