

## **King Street Community Voices Photography Competition 2011**

### **What is it?**

King Street Community Voices is launching a photographic competition to capture the changing face of the King Street area of Norwich. Once an industrial heartland producing such goods as shoes, beer, mustard and machinery, the area has been through some hard times. A dramatic recent programme of regeneration and development is transforming this part of Norwich, juxtaposing the ancient with the modern. Now forming a significant Cultural Quarter of historic buildings, arts organisations and creative businesses, King Street has always been central to the flow of communication and ideas into the city, via both the road itself and the River Wensum.

### **What is the theme?**

The competition's theme is **Continuity and Change: A Picture of King Street in 2011**

The theme reflects the changing nature of the area and complements the **Continuity and Change: A Picture of King Street** exhibition of archive photographs and film at Dragon Hall 22-31 March 2011.

Entries can be in colour or black and white, portrait or landscape view. They can include buildings and the urban landscape, people and places, objects or other more ephemeral interpretations. They should reflect the entrant's ideas of how the area is changing.

Judges will consider:

- Composition and photographic content
- Creativity and originality
- How well it illustrates the theme

### **Categories**

There are two age categories for the competition: one for under 18s and one for 18s and over. Prizes will be awarded to the three best entries in each category. The judging panel includes noted Norfolk photographers Richard Denyer and Dave Guttridge.

### **Dates**

The competition will be open for submissions from 10am on **Monday 4 April 2011**

No entries will be accepted after 4pm on **Friday 6 May 2011**

Winners will be notified by **Friday 27 May 2011**

The winning photographs will be exhibited at Dragon Hall during summer 2011.

**King Street Community Voices is a Heritage Lottery Funded oral history and archive project based at Dragon Hall on King Street. Dragon Hall is a charity managed by the Norfolk and Norwich Heritage Trust, registered charity no. 285115.**

## Terms and Conditions

1. All entrants must submit a completed entry form
2. All images submitted must be the work of the author named on the entry form
3. Images entered for this competition must not have previously won or been shortlisted for any other photography competition or been published elsewhere
4. Entrants agree by entering the competition to participate in post-competition publicity arranged by the organisers
5. By entering the competition entrants confirm that they have the permission of any persons pictured in the image (and for under 18s, the permission of a parent or guardian) for the use set out below, and will indemnify King Street Community Voices against any claims made by third parties in respect of such an infringement
6. By entering the competition you are granting Dragon Hall and King Street Community Voices a free, non-exclusive continuous licence to use your photograph(s) for marketing purposes in any format which may include, but is not limited to, Dragon Hall's website and marketing materials, in exhibitions and to support press releases. Copyright will remain with the author and credit will be given where used.
7. Photographs will be entered into King Street Community Voices' archive as a record of the area, for research and educational purposes only
8. Entrants are responsible for informing King Street Community Voices of any changes to the information entered on the entry form, in particular any change to contact details
9. Manipulation of images is accepted provided that all works are original works and not copies of other people's work
10. No entries will be accepted before 10am on Monday 4 April 2011 or after 4pm on Friday 6 May 2011
11. Each entrant can submit up to a maximum of three photographs
12. Entries must follow the 'How to Enter' notes and terms and conditions; entries that do not may be disqualified
13. King Street Community Voices does not accept responsibility for any entries lost in transit, damaged entries or incomplete entries. If you include a valid email address or stamped addressed envelope we will send you notification to say your entry has arrived
14. Entries may not be withdrawn once entered
15. King Street Community Voices regrets entries cannot be returned
16. Judges will include Richard Denyer and Dave Guttridge
17. The judges' decisions are final
18. King Street Community Voices regrets no individual feedback can be given
19. Winners will be notified by Friday 27 May 2011
20. It may be necessary for images submitted to be cropped or altered slightly for the purpose of reproducing them
21. The competition is not open to employees of Dragon Hall, the Norfolk and Norwich Heritage Trust, King Street Community Voices and their immediate families, or anyone professionally connected with the competition
22. King Street Community Voices reserves the right to change the terms and conditions if deemed necessary to do so
23. Entrants' details will be stored on King Street Community Voices' computer system for the purposes of the competition. By entering the competition, entrants agree that the organisers can collect, save and process the personal data provided for the purposes of the competition. King Street Community Voices and will not disclose this personal data to other organisations. If other organisations are interested in contacting entrants about their photography, King Street Community Voices will seek permission from the photographer concerned first.

## How to Enter

Make sure you have read the terms and conditions. You can enter between one and three photos.

Entries can be in colour or black and white, portrait or landscape view. They can include buildings and the urban landscape, people and places, objects or other more ephemeral interpretations. They should reflect the entrant's own ideas of how the area is changing.

If you are entering more than one image please make sure you label each photograph clearly. However, only one entry form needs to be filled out.

Please note **we will only accept entries sent in electronically by email or digitally on CD**, although the original format can be film.

## To Enter:

### By Email

1. Save your photo(s) as jpegs, minimum of 300 dpi, **up to a maximum file size of 5MB per image** and label each image file clearly with your name AND image title or corresponding number from the entry form
2. Fill out the entry form and attach to your email
3. Send your email to [kscv@dragonhall.org](mailto:kscv@dragonhall.org) with your name in the subject line, up to a maximum size of 5MB. If your combined image sizes exceed this maximum, either make the images smaller or split up your entries into several emails

### By Post

1. Save your photo(s) to a single CD as jpegs or tifs, minimum of 300 dpi, **up to a maximum file size of 10MB per image**
2. Label the CD with your name and label each image file clearly with your name AND image title or corresponding number from the entry form
3. Fill out the entry form (written or typed) and enclose with your CD

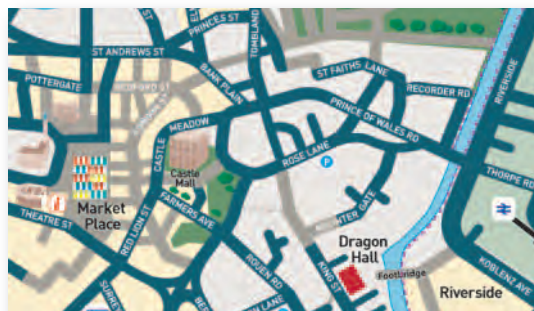
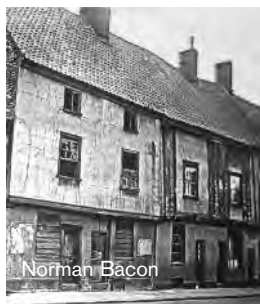
