Art Fund Boost

The UK's biggest art charity, the Art Fund intends to increase the amount it makes available for galleries to buy works of art by more than 50% by 2014 by giving £7m annually – a significant uplift from the present £4.5m. The charity also launched a new National Art Pass, which will give members of the charity free entry to over 200 museums and half-price admittance to temporary shows.

£2m Lottery Film Fund to Support Specialised & British Film (UK)

The British Film Institute (BFI) has announced a new £2 million transitional Lottery Film Fund aimed at supporting organisations such as independent cinemas, film festivals, film clubs and societies, arts centres and regional archives, across the UK, to continue their work in delivering audience development activities for specialised and British film. With a new film strategy and funding priorities planned to take effect in 2012, the fund aims to provide transitional financial support for one year to give organisations the stability and continuity to cope not only with challenging finances, but also with structural changes in public funding across film. The fund in due to open for applications in early May 2011 and organisations will have one month to apply for funding. Grants can only be made to community radio licensees who are broadcasting under a community radio licence (and not an RSL, for example).
