

Take One Picture

An enquiry based approach to the curriculum

16th June 2011, 9.30am-3.30pm, Norwich Castle Museum & Art Gallery

This course offers the opportunity for teachers to experience and more fully understand the successful 'Take One Picture' approach (initially developed by the National Gallery). Participants will hear a keynote presentation by Nigel Meager, an art education specialist, before being introduced to a range of active enquiry approaches using one picture from the collection. There will be time spent considering the ways that this approach can inform and shape both cross curricular and national curriculum subject planning. The use of the picture as a powerful stimulus and context for improving writing (**using drama strategies**) will also be considered. The transferable approaches promoted during the day will be of future use to schools when planning the curriculum creatively around any visual stimulus of their choice.

The course objectives are to:

- to **inspire teachers** own creative approaches
- to **practically exemplify** how one picture can be used as a cross curricular learning stimulus
- to **increase teachers' knowledge** of active enquiry approaches linked to visual images
- to provide collaborative medium and short term **planning opportunities**
