Dear Colleague

What is the most straightforward way of raising pupils' attainment? What if that way also met the needs of APP & resulted in AfL? What if success was guaranteed?

By raising attainment I am not thinking about the occasional rise of a Level 3 to a Level 4 at KS2, welcome though each such improvement is. Rather I'm thinking about the school which in a 2 year period went from 33% of pupils achieving Level 4 in writing to 84%. From 63% to 88% in Maths in a one year. The school whose CVA went from the bottom 5% nationally to the top 5% in the same two year period. This sort of improvement is possible and can be achieved by any school that utilises Red Hall Primary School's approach which rigorously integrates target setting, tracking, mentoring & checking systems. To give spectacular results. It will lead a school out of difficulty or lift a good school to the next level: because it raises achievement for all!
