### Grease and Water – Exhibition at Gallery Plus, Wells

We are delighted to be staging the first solo exhibition by young Cambridge artist Michael Papworth, whose hand-drawn lithographs have already proved extremely popular at Gallery Plus.

Michael's work gives an insight into the way he portrays the English countryside, using various printmaking techniques and, for this exhibition, he is producing some work specific to the North Norfolk coast and the Wells area in particular ... expect to see his typical tree substituted for a beach hut or a boat.

Michael started working in the art industry at an early age of 14 as a gallery assistant and picture framer and found this a fascinating time, as he was then developing his skills as an artist and experimenting in different areas. He gained a National Diploma in Art & Design at Long Road College in Cambridge and discovered that his work was dramatically changing and a definite style emerging as he became more focused on landscapes. In January 2008 he started working at The Curwen Studio at Chilford Hall as a studio printmaker, where he worked alongside artists such as Paula Rego, Angie Lewin and Mark Hearld to create original, hand-drawn lithographs. He also worked on a four-colour reproduction technique that attracts artists like Mary Fedden and The Prince of Wales. This gave him a great opportunity to really see how artists like these work, and to transfer their knowledge into his own work.

North Norfolk has been awash with 124 decorated deckchairs since April as part of the <u>Cromer and Sheringham Crab & Lobster Festival</u>. From Fakenham to Woodbastwick the deckchairs are on show until Sunday 21 August before they all go into the Grand Deckchair Charity Auction to raise money for the Festival's charities; The Fishermen's Mission, RNLI Cromer and RNLI Sheringham. The auction will be held on bank holiday Sunday 28 August at 2pm on Cromer Pier Forecourt. The auction will be the first and only time people will have a chance to see all 124 deckchairs displayed together. These will be on view from 10am on the day of the auction.

The 124 lots on sale, sponsored by local businesses and tricolated by local people, include deckchairs decorated by internationally collected artists Lizzie Riches, Kit Wade and David Morris, Dianne Lindsay, Kate Royall and Anna-Lise Horsley.

Schools, youth groups, business, organisations and many talented local people have produced a stunning array of quirky deckchairs from Royal weddinginspired and crossword crazy chairs. People have painted, knitted, printed, sewn, adorned and transformed their deckchairs in an array of methods and all will be auctioned for charity.

Included within the sale are the four giant deckchairs which have featured in the trail. These have been handmade by the Open Door Art Project in Sheringham for the Festival and have received wondrous attention from locals and visitors alike who have taken on the challenge of the trail.
