The Norfolk Café Programme

Norfolk's Cafe programme is an approach but also an agreed process by which settings/ schools work with families in order for all parents/ carers to confidently support key aspects of their child's learning and development and feel able to work in partnership with the setting/ school. Learning outcomes are thereby improved (especially in oracy, literacy and mathematics), aspirational learning communities are created and strong school/ family partnerships formed.

Story Café

The Story Café focuses on the **development of speaking**, **listening and early literacy** skills. For children/ pupils aged 3-6 years.



Reading Café


The Reading Café focuses on the development of key reading skills.

Maths Café

The Maths Café focuses on key **mathematical skills**. Maths Café is suitable for aged 4-7 and aged 7-12 pupils. Training will include practical ideas and activites to enhance the teaching of mathematics using a wide variety of resources (including those found in the home).

Investors in Families Quality Mark (new national standards from September 2011)

Is your school already working effectively with your families, or is this a key development area for you?

The national Investors in Families Quality Mark provides a framework for schools and settings to develop their partnership work with families as part of school improvement. It is also a means for schools/settings to ide



improvement. It is also a means for schools/ settings to identify and celebrate what they have already achieved in this key area of partnership working.

Working with families remains a priority in the new Ofsted Framework as from January 2012. Feedback from the 80 Norfolk settings and schools already holding, or working towards the quality mark, has been that the process and award have been valuable for them during Ofsted Inspections.

The half day training session can be for up to 3 delegates from each school/ setting (at no extra cost and we recommend this includes a governor's attendance). The half day training explores the requirements of the award, evidencing, participation from all stakeholders, evaluation and impact measuring.

Costs are based on a support package which includes:

- Registration fee to national programme initial training session for up to 3 delegates
- An interim review of progress towards the quality mark (clinic format)
- · Final assessment by regional accredited assessor
- Final report for external verification
- External fees to liF national programme for verification

Additional support visits can be offered to support the process (which will incur additional costs)
