Day visits to Easton College

<u>Grants towards transport costs for</u> <u>visits to working farms</u>

NFEL works with the Clan Trust to provide grants towards the cost of transport for a Norfolk school visit to a working farm. These grants are only made for visits to farms where the staff are CEVAS trained. The grants are on a sliding scale between £30 and £60 depending on the amount of the coach bill. The grants are administered by the Farm Education Co-ordinator at Easton College who is able to provide advice about which CEVAS trained farmers are taking part in the scheme.

Application forms for a transport grant are provided by the farmer hosting the visit.
