"Legacy - from London to Brazil" is a cross-curricular project using the theme of the Brazilian play-fight/dance Capoeira.

The Brazilian game of Capoeira is visually spectacular teaches pupils physical and mental control in an engaging way. A half-term long series of Capoeira sessions across your school will actively explore the values of the Olympic Games (see below). The sessions touch on geography, history, music and PHSE and PE. Physically earning dodges, kicks, cartwheels and handstands pupils of all ages find the learning experience exciting and engaging.

With the 2012 Games in mind, our programmes explore and uphold the Olympic Values of respect, excellence and friendship in the following practical, energetic and enjoyable ways :

Within the programme we discuss and experience;

- excellence in our physical practice; we break down the moves in an accessible way and encourage quality practice and repetition for achieving goals
- friendship, tolerance and understanding; pupils learn some Portuguese language in our lessons, we highlight the Olympic Truce to put national conflicts and cultural differences aside.
- having respect for ourselves and each other; the game itself depends on respect between the players; we discuss the slave trade, how the slaves treated each other
- looking forward to Brazil as the next Olympic host nation

Although PE and sport are central to the Games, Get Set is not just for PE teachers - it supports a number of areas of learning, e.g. PSHE, Citizenship, Literacy and Numeracy. The Olympic TruceThe Olympic Truce originated during the Ancient Olympic Games when fighting ceased from seven days before until seven days after the Games, allowing athletes, artists and spectators to travel to Olympia, participate in the Olympic Games and return to their homelands in peace.

In the 21st century, the core principle of the Olympic Truce is to build a more peaceful and better world through sport and the Olympic ideal and to use sport to promote and encourage peace, mutual respect, reconciliation and conflict resolution between and within communities.

The Olympic ValuesThe Olympic and Paralympic Games are about much more than sporting excellence. Underpinning the Games is the philosophy of

Pierre de Coubertin, the founder of the Modern Olympic Movement. He saw in the Games an ideal opportunity to develop a set of universal principles – or Values – that could be applied to education and to society as a whole, as well as to sport itself. The Values are:

- respect fair play; knowing one's own limits; and taking care of one's health and the environment
- excellence how to give the best of oneself, on the field of play or in life; taking part; and progressing according to one's own objectives
- friendship how, through sport, to understand each other despite any differences.

Costing£140 for approx 3 hours, normally divided into three classes of around 30-35 pupils each.For example, a six-week Legacy project would cost £840 plus travel expenses at 45ppm.This high quality activity has been well received by staff and pupils alike, if you wish to find out more please arrange a meeting and we will be happy to discuss ways of getting a Legacy project up and running.
