We are looking forward to teaching English, Maths, ICT and team-working skills through our football or speedway-linked education programmes to students from Larkman Primary, Horsford Primary, Kinsale Junior, Firside Junior, Springwood High School Academy, Gayton Primary, Ashwicken Primary, Highgate Infant, Sprowston Community High, Foulsham Primary, Sheringham High and Astley Primary school.

## STARS Nurture

The STARS Study Centre is currently working with 6 year 2 pupils from Highgate Infants School. STARS Nurture group is designed to build self esteem, and helps to re-engage the pupils into the school environment and their own learning.

## FREE Sports and leisure course

## NCFC players reward young learners

More than 30 school children were awarded educational honours by two NCFC players at Carrow Road on 13<sup>th</sup> September.

Striker Simeon Jackson and on-loan defender Ritchie De Laet presented certificates, medals and trophies to students from Sprowston Community High, Catton Grove Primary, Lionwood Junior, Magdalen Gates Primary, Stalham High, Hethersett High and Reepham High schools.

The students completed a football-themed educational course called Double Club, which improves English and Maths skills in the classroom as well as football skills on the school field - hence the name 'Double'.

The programme involves a tutor teaching groups of 15 students an extra hour of literacy and numeracy a week, at their schools, with all sessions themed around football. Afterwards, the students are rewarded with an hour's football coaching.
