If you work with young people, music, bands or are involved with rock school projects this is the event for you! Not to be missed - The first ever national Rock Schools Convention is being hosted at The 02 Arena in London. Just £25 for a full day of speakers, networking and entrance to The British Music Experience museum.

The event, which takes place at the British Music Experience, on Friday 3rd February next year is being organised by The Garage, Sound Connections and Rhythmix on behalf of MusicLeader - a national network, funded by Youth Music, which provides support and development for the music leading and teaching workforce.

The event offers rock schools around the country a chance to exchange different models of work, knowledge and good practice. Aspiring Rock School organisers will also be able to learn how to set-up their own school and there will be presentations from key organisations working in the UK music industry.

Rock Schools use performance and music making as a way to inspire young people to learn new skills and gain greater confidence. The Rock School model first appeared in the US with the Paul Green School of Rock, reputed to be the inspiration behind the Jack Black movie, and its proving a growing movement here in the UK.

The event will feature representatives from trade and support organisations, live music and free entry into the British Music Experience, presented by The Cooperative – Britain's interactive museum of popular music based in The O2, London.

This Project Management course is aimed at music leaders and creative practitioners. Part of a set of three courses that together develop the skills needed to take an idea from planning and preparation, through to fundraising, delivery and finally evaluation.

Learn how to plan and present your ideas in a way that satisfies partners and funders. Use your plans to inform a successful delivery and finally measure and prove the success of the project. The course will be led by Rosy Prue, a very experienced trainer, action learning facilitator and arts practitioner. This course can be booked as a full three part course or singularly.

Artist in Residence, The Alexandra Reinhardt Memorial Award Deadline 2.30 pm February 3rd 2012.

We are looking for an artist, working in any medium, to run a series of art workshops at the Robert Blair School, London. The winning artist will be required to run 12 full day weekly workshops with children aged 7 - 11. The artist will be working with three groups of children during the day who will remain the same over the 12 week period. The residency will run from April through to mid July. The artist is also expected to produce a 3D artwork for permanent at the Robert Blair School, in response to the residency. The installation can be either for an interior or exterior venue. There is an opportunity to use a roof garden at the school to exhibit the installation.

The residency is run in association with The Art Room a charity that offers art as therapy to young people aged 5 -15 to raise their self-esteem, self confidence and independence. Most are disengaged from mainstream education, disruptive or withdrawn and all have been identified as needing special time away from their school. Many of the students have specific learning difficulties or have had an interrupted education.

The winning artist will be awarded £10,000 to fund their time, all materials and creation of a 3D artwork.

Awards for Young Musicians deadline: 23 March 2012

Awards for Young Musicians supports the UK's most talented young instrumentalists aged five to 17 years of age who, because of financial need, may be prevented from fulfilling their creative potential. The charity assists musically-gifted children in families, where income is limited, to help develop potential.Grants of between £200 and £2,000 are available, based on evidence of musical talent and financial need. Eligible applicants:

- must have settled status in the UK on 1 September 2011;
- need to be 17 or under at 31 August 2012; and

Countess of Munster Musical Trust deadline: 14 February 2013

The chief focus of the Countess of Munster Musical Trust is on the provision of grants to support music students throughout advanced training. Past beneficiaries may also apply for interest-free loans for the purchase of musical instruments. A sponsorship scheme is also available to help talented beneficiaries.

Grants for Study: No minimum or maximum levels of grant funding have been specified. The Trustees decide the value of grant following an audition. Grants are not made for longer than one year at a time.

Loans for Instrument Purchase: A limited amount of the Trust's fund is set aside to assist young professional musicians with the purchase of new instruments. Such assistance is offered in the form of an interest-free loan, repayable over periods varying from five to 12 years.

Stephen Oliver Award: One award is available biennially to cover some of the costs of bringing a piece of work, that is being written for musical theatre, to performance.For more information visit: <u>www.munstertrust.org.uk</u>

Clore Duffield Poetry & Literary Awards deadline: 30 March 2012

Young Persons Volunteering Fund (England, Scotland and Wales)

The Sita Trust has announced the next funding round of its new Young Person's Volunteering Fund. Through this new fund, the SITA Trust can provide grants of up to £10,000 for volunteering projects owned by 14-25 year olds. The SITA Trust can support projects in any of 90 funding zones around qualifying waste processing sites operated by their donor, SITA UK. This fund has been created to assist young people aged 14-25 to volunteer their time to create or enhance facilities that can be enjoyed by the wider community. To be eligible applicants must be able to demonstrate that young people will be fully involved in the design and development of the project and projects must be compliant with the rules of the Landfill Communities Fund.The next closing date for applications is 10am on the 3rd January 2012. Music Grants for Older People (England & Wales)

The registered charity, Concertina makes grants to charitable bodies which provide musical entertainment and related activities for the elderly. The charity is particular keen to support smaller organisations which might otherwise find it difficult to gain funding. Since its inception in 2004, it has made grants to a wide range of charitable organisations nationwide in England and Wales. These include funds to many care homes for the elderly to provide musical entertainment for their residents. Some of the charities that have received grants from the charity include:

- Age Concern, Exmouth which received a grant for entertainments for the elderly in Exmouth and surrounding areas.
- Sue Ryder Care, Lancashire to fund access to music therapy workshops at Birchley Hall near Wigan and St Helen's.

Parks for People (UK)

The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) has announced that the next closing date for applications to the Parks for People programme is the 28th February 2012. Launched originally as a joint initiative with the Big Lottery Fund full responsibility for the programme has now passed to the Heritage Lottery Fund Local Authorities as well as not for profit organisations that own public parks and gardens can apply for grants of between £250,000 and £5 million for the regeneration of parks and public gardens (including squares, walks and promenades). To be considered for funding, applicants need to show that the community values the park as part of their heritage; the parks meets local social, economic and environmental needs; and the park management actively involves local people. Recent awards include:

- A £1.84 million grant to restore Castle Park in Cheshire back to its original historic landscape and to improve sports facilities, the play area, and cafe and kiosk facilities.
- A £3.5million grant to restore the historic landscaping and buildings, upgrading footpaths, entrances, furniture and signage of Brockwell Park which is located between Brixton, Norwood and Dulwich.
