Due to demand the training programme that accompanied the launch of Norfolk's new Personal Education Plan (PEP) for Looked After Children is being repeated.

There are three sessions remaining, running until the end of March 2012, so if you haven't yet attended, this is a final opportunity to take advantage of the training.

These multi-agency sessions are attended by foster carers, Designated Teachers, Independent Reviewing Officers and social workers and provide an opportunity to explore the PEP process and the necessity of investing in it to improve educational outcomes for children in care.

Designated Teachers for Looked After Children are pivotal in enhancing the PEP process and their presence at multi-agency training gives an important dimension.

All children and young people in care need to have a Personal Education Plan or PEP. The PEP brings together their care and education information in one document, so that all those working with a child know the essential information about their education.

Following the launch of the new PEP format last year, this workshop aims to take a detailed look at it, with advice and information on how to complete it. There will be opportunities for discussion and feedback for practitioners to promote interdisciplinary understanding and collaboration, and to ensure the success of the PEP process.

During this session, time will be spent exploring the process and necessity of investing in it, in order to highlight how multi-agency working can improve educational opportunities for children in care.
