#### A Level Study Day

80+ musicians came together in Norwich at the beginning of November and A Level music students performed set works. They were supported by music teachers, NMS staff, retired musicians and two professional string players from the Britten Sinfonia. Eleven of the nineteen vocal and instrumental set works for AS and A2 were performed, with a most eclectic range of composers represented: Weelkes, Gabrieli, Corelli, Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Berlioz, Shostakovich, Carl Perkins, The Beatles and Mustapha Tettey Addy.

#### **High School Choirs**

Over 350 young singers, their music teachers and NMS peripatetic teachers attended the 9<sup>th</sup> annual choir



festival, conducted by Richard Allain at St Andrew's Hall in October.

Fifty instrumentalists of the Norfolk Symphonic Wind Band, conducted by David Stowell, alternated pieces with the vocal items.

Musical styles ranged from Handel, Mozart, folksong and spirituals to songs from Snow Patrol and Les Miserables. The Symphonic Wind Band was also varied in its repertoire: film, folk and nationalist programme music.
