## <u>Training Event: Domestic, Sexual and Honour Based Abuse, 14 March</u> 2012, West Norfolk Professional Development Centre

Explain dynamics of Domestic Abuse (DA), Sexual Abuse (SA) & Honour Based Abuse (HBA) used on/by young people;

Recognise the signs of abuse using examples; Barriers for victims to get help and report to police; Identify partner/3<sup>rd</sup> Sector agencies that can help victims of DA, SA & HBA.

## **On-Line Training: Forced Marriage**

In addition, the Forced Marriage Unit has designed a free e-learning training package to support professionals, including education staff that may have to deal with forced marriage in the course of their work. Using real life case studies, the training will give professionals a basic understanding of the key issues surrounding forced marriage, how cases can present and how to respond appropriately. It is recommended that the SDP and other staff who have a responsibility for managing safeguarding and school attendance access this training.
