About FILMCLUB

FILMCLUB is a government backed and Ofsted commended educational charity that enables schools to set up and run extra-curricular, weekly film clubs.

FILMCLUB is flexible, easy to use, and covers all age groups from Key Stage 1 right through to Key Stage 5. Through FILMCLUB, young people watch, discuss and review the very best in world cinema every week. With the chance to see a total of 39 films in an average school year, club members are taken on diverse film journeys, which in turn support their cultural, social and academic development.

The charity (no. 1136558) is championed by headteachers and key figures in education, and has grown from a 25-school pilot in 2007 - with support from the Department for Education, the Welsh Assembly and LOVEFiLM - to reaching 220,000 children each week, in over 7,000 clubs.

Young people who join their school's club become members on the FILMCLUB website and part of a growing online community with a critical and creative focus. Online members are able to submit reviews, enter exciting competitions, identify films they would like to watch at their club, and learn about the film industry.

Participation in FILMCLUB has a positive impact on students' critical thinking, discussion and literacy skills, as well as building confidence and developing social skills. Being fully inclusive, FILMCLUB has also been found to integrate isolated or disengaged young people.
