Call for Artists: The Salisbury Giant

Salisbury Arts Centre is inviting a local visual artist to lead a participatory arts project that will engage the public in community arts as well as their local history through creatively responding to the idea of the Salisbury Giant. The Salisbury Giant housed in Salisbury and South Wiltshire Museum stands over 12ft tall and is decorated with coats of arms. He was originally used by the Salisbury Guild of Tailors during the medieval period to exhibit the clothing they had produced as well as for their annual celebration on midsummer's day. The tailors flourished in Salisbury during this period due to the prosperity which was brought to the town through the wool trade and cloth manufacture. Later the Giant was used for public celebrations, such as coronations or jubilees, along with his companion Hob-Nob who cavorted in front of the procession to clear the way. We are inviting an artist to respond to the theme of the Giant and its symbol as a celebration of Salisbury by creating a community arts project that engages the public in the creation of a temporary sculptural work/s that can be made by and/or added to by members of the public. The materials used could reflect Salisbury's rich textile history or perhaps take a modern twist on the giant's medieval roots or purpose. Your challenge is to encourage meaningful participation by Wiltshire residents in a pressured environment, to highlight this part of Salisbury's history and to enable the creation of a surprising and visually impressive piece of local artwork. The giant will be created by hundreds of local people of all ages who will drop-in throughout the day as part of Wiltshire's celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Year. You will need to be able to transport/carry the work created to the Guildhall at the end of the day (with assistance from Guildhall staff if needed) where it will be displayed to the public. The fee for the project is £2500 inclusive of preparation, research time, attendance on the day, materials and VAT. Funding for the project has come from the Salisbury Area Board.

The project will take place on Tuesday 1 May 2012, 10am - 5.30pm in the grounds of Salisbury Cathedral, adjacent to Salisbury's Tournament tent. The tent can be used to store materials, and in the event of bad weather it may become appropriate to construct the art work within the tent.

Prizes will be awarded to members aged between 16 and 30. The money can be used to support any artistic discipline the applicant is working in. For example, individuals might require a vital cash injection for an existing project, or funding to get a brand new idea off the ground. The £500 can be part of the budget or make up the full budget of the project.

The panel is hoping to fund initiatives inspired in some way by a location. Projects from all over the UK which celebrate the diversity of the regions are especially welcome. IdeasTap members will be encouraged to collaborate on interdisciplinary projects.

Applications are accepted from groups or individuals. One person must take the lead and has the main responsibility for managing the application and any money awarded. By groups of people, the sponsor means a single group of people working towards a shared or common goal.

ACE Creative People & Places Fund

Arts Council England is offering funding to local consortiums to help get local people involved in the arts across parts of England where arts involvement is considerably below the national average.

Funding will be given to these areas to establish long-term partnerships between local communities and arts organisations, museums, libraries and local authorities, called Creative People and Places. The programme aims to empower them to experiment with new and innovative approaches to develop inspiring, sustainable arts programmes that will engage audiences in those communities.

A total of £37 million will be available to establish around 15 projects between autumn 2012 and autumn 2015. It is anticipated that the majority of proposals will be for between £500,000 and £3 million over three years. It is expected that at least 10% of total project costs should come from other sources. This can also be in kind.

Consortiums of local communities, arts organisations, museums, libraries and local authorities are eligible to apply. Intentions to apply should be registered by 23 March 2012. The deadline for first round applications is 13 April 2012. A second round of applications will take place in autumn 2012.

Catalyst Arts & Heritage Grants

Catalyst Arts and Catalyst Heritage fundraising capacity building grants are open access grant schemes aimed at arts and heritage organisations with little or no fundraising experience. Grants of between £15,000 and £25,000 will be awarded to organisations for the purpose of building fundraising capacity and capability so that they can attract new donors, strengthen their financial resilience and enhance their artistic output or engagement with the public.

Funding can be used for organisations to make themselves more attractive to donors; to identify and secure new donors; or to ensure that funders want to keep giving.

Some of the types of activity might include freeing up the leadership of an organisation to fundraise; improving the organisation's appeal and image to attract new funders; collaborating with other arts or heritage organisations to attract new funds; applying fundraising tools and techniques used by other types of organisations to attract funding; and using new technologies or techniques such as crowd-sourcing to help attract new funding.

Young Persons Volunteering Fund (England, Scotland and Wales)

Grants for Planting Trees (UK)

The Tree Council, the lead tree campaigning charity working to promote the importance of trees within the changing environment, has announced that its Trees for Communities and Trees for Schools grant making programmes are now open for applications.

Funds are available for schools and community groups within the UK who are able to show that children under the age of 16 will be actively engaged in tree planting projects during National Tree Week 2012 (24th November to 2nd December 2012). The Tree Council can fund projects between £100 and £700 and successful applicants will receive up to 75% towards their planting costs. Enhancing Communities Programme (England, Scotland and Wales)

Under the Sita Trust's Enhancing Communities Programme Core Fund, grants of up to £60,000 are available to not for profit organisations, community groups, parish councils, local authorities and charities for projects that make physical improvements to community facilities and historic buildings / structures. SITA will accept applications from projects which are within 3 miles of qualifying SITA UK waste processing sites. Grants of up to £20,000 are also available through their Fast Track Fund for projects with an overall cost of no more than £40,000. Projects on school or pre-school sites where the facilities will primarily benefit the school are not eligible. However, an application may be considered from a school if it can be clearly demonstrated:

- That the wider community has significant opportunities to use the facility.
- The facility is run by an organisation that is separate from the school (although the school may be represented).
- Access to the facility for community use must be via an entrance that is separate from the school.

Previous projects supported through the programme include:

- A £10,000 grant to Ashtead Cricket Club to resurface and restore the playing field of the former Parsons Mead School to create a sports pitch that can be used for cricket and football.
- A £10,000 grant to enable the replacement of existing electric radiant heaters with a modern combination condensing boiler at All Saint's Church Hall in Guildford.
