Effective CPD is vital for school improvement, particularly if it raises standards of attainment and achievement by improving the quality of teaching and learning. Our courses have this as a central focus.

Developing Teaching Assistants

Brown and Harris* found that increasing expenditure on Teaching Assistants was associated with raising standards. Our NPETCS programme is unique and proven to make an impact; aimed at Teaching Assistants to equip them with the knowledge for teaching PE and ensuring the delivery of High Quality PE and School Sport. We have 28 candidates taking part in the 2012 programme; on completion they will join over 200 Teaching Assistants that have already successfully achieved this High Quality PE Award.

Stage 3: Staff and **Pupil Twilight** With the help of some pupils,

teachers get to grips with apparatus handling, progressing pupils onto the apparatus from floor, safety, extending and challenging the more able, enabling the less able, supporting pupils physically.

Working in the Cluster Model an improvement programme can be developed in partnership with NIEAS and the County PE Adviser. To ensure effective support to deliver the objectives, a three stage development plan is available to schools who recognise this effective way of working.

Stage 1: Subject Leader Twilight

Planning and identifying the reasons behind the need. PE Adviser works with PE Subject Leaders to plan a progressive developmental programme to ensure staff are supported to deliver higher quality lessons, assess pupil progress more effectively and challenge and extend pupils within a safe learning environment. Also identifying the success criteria to ensure objectives have been met to ensure the impact of the programme.

Stage 2: Staff Training Twilight (Practical)

Covering aspects of safety, common misconceptions, what must be taught, how to deliver this effectively. Introducing basic skills, resource cards, DVD material, sequencing and putting together movements which link and flow answering the requirements of the national curriculum. Developing staff confidence so that they can teach high quality gymnastics, giving them tools and skills to do this.
