Given the refocusing of inspection towards teaching, it aims to support school leaders at all levels in the application of the new Ofsted ‘Quality of Teaching’ criteria when making judgements.

A range of related evidence will be considered, but there will be a specific focus on developing and refining the skills required to conduct lesson observations to assist teacher development as well as monitor school improvement.

By the end of the course, participants should be able to:

- **understand** how the new draft Teachers’ Standards relate to the 2012 Ofsted criteria
- **apply** understanding of the ‘Quality of Teaching’ descriptors consistently to all lesson observations
- **consider** how to triangulate lesson observations with a wider range of evidence to reach a judgement on the quality of teaching and learning
- **look at** how judgements could be used to secure improvements in the quality of teaching and learning
