RSPB Living Classrooms at Strumpshaw Fen offers a range of outdoor education programmes for EYFS, KS1 and KS2.

Our experienced team of professional field teachers is keen to share the enthusiasm and passion we have for outdoor learning and I would be delighted to discuss our programme of activities with you and organise a memorable day for pupils and staff alike.

Strumpshaw Fen is only 6 miles away from Norwich, but it is worlds away from the hustle and bustle of modern life: a 'breathing space for the soul' as Ted Ellis would say.

With an inspiring range of activities we can help you plan your summer field trip and target appropriate aspects of the science curriculum. We aim to make your visit as exciting and rewarding for the children and teachers as possible. We have a dedicated space for outdoor learning in three distinct Broads habitats, a good range of resources, and an amazing range of wildlife to discover. Our programmes aim to be flexible to ensure we inspire pupils and meet your requirements. All our activities are risk assessed, curriculum-linked and carefully

designed to complement the work done in schools.

EYFS & KS1

Children are offered first-hand experiences of natural places, creatures and habitats through a series of innovative sensory activities, as well as opportunities to pond dip, minibeast in different habitats, and birdwatch. These activities are linked to outcomes for EYFS and KS1.

KS₂

Our programmes are linked to the national curriculum and offer a range of activities linked to the National Curriculum including life processes and living things, habitat exploration, plants and animals in the local environment, helping plants grow, using keys to identify plants and animals and identifying food chains.

In addition we aim to give pupils a sense of place and allow opportunities to explore some iconic Broads habitats and landscapes.



To help your class get ready for their Strumpshaw Fen field trip we can organise a pre visit where we provide a range of preparatory activities and games to get everyone inspired. We can also organise post Strumpshaw Fen visits to follow up their practical learning experiences and extend their wildlife knowledge. Either way we can be adaptable to meet your needs, offering environmental games and outdoor activities.

We can also offer a varied outreach programme throughout the Spring and Autumn terms, and can work with whole year groups through School Assemblies, or with individual classes. Our exciting range of wildlife topics including Robins, Owls, Sumatra Rain Forest, Bird Beaks & Adaptation, Schools Birdwatching and many more....

What is the cost?

Children will be able to explore nature for themselves by studying at first-hand the birds, animals, plants and habitats at Strumpshaw Fen. Led by experienced field teachers, the half- or full-day visits are carefully crafted to open eyes and minds to the captivating world around us.

Strumpshaw Fen is only 10 miles from Norwich City Centre, with fantastic facilities to enable your pupils to explore a diverse range of habitats. Pupils can explore woodland, broadland and meadowland habitats, in areas designated specifically for educational use and within easy walking distance. The RSPB's field teaching programme aims to provide pupils with a wildlife experience they will remember and a learning adventure that is fun, hands-on and educational.

Key Stage 2

Second nature

Our programme for 8–12 year olds is designed to enable children to discover the variety of creatures and habitats at Strumpshaw. Pupils can explore and compare woodland and meadow habitats, hunt for minibeasts, investigate the water cycle and enjoy birdwatching using binoculars and a telescope.
