There's a Norfolk you know and a Norfolk you never see.

The Household Cavalry bring their horses here and take them into the foaming waves off Holkham sands, and then charge full gallop, screaming with swords drawn across an open field. A dancer dances into an Aquarium on a beach, instead of the sea behind her. Cliffs erode before your eyes and a fishing community faces an uncertain future.

On show at the North Norfolk Council Office's **First Floor Gallery**, Holt Road, Cromer, are an eclectic series of photographs recorded in Black and White and infrared of a Norfolk inspired by events and places not many people see. Photographs from a forthcoming book *'The Last Hunters'* which tells the stories of the Cromer crab fishermen and their families in their own words will also be featured.

Professional Photographer of the Year 2009 and Reportage section of Black & White Photographer of the Year 2010, **David Morris** is a fine art photographer of people, landscapes and architecture. Born in East Yorkshire, now living in Cromer, David is one of the exciting and very talented artists exhibiting this year at the **First Floor Gallery**. Curator's Talk with Krzysztof Fijalkowski

Thursday 15 March 7 - 8.30pm:

The Queen of Hungary Project Space,

Krzysztof Fijalkowski is a Senior Lecturer in Fine Art, Norwich University College of the Arts. Variously active as an artist, curator and translator, his recent research activity has included catalogue publications for the V&A and Tate Liverpool, and a forthcoming book on Czech Surrealist Photography.

Krzysztof's talk will focus on his contributions to two past exhibition projects around the themes of space, psychoanalysis and surrealism: Kathleen Fox's installation The Spaces of the Unconscious at the Freud Museum London, and Surreal House at the Barbican Gallery, both in the summer / autumn of 2010. Kathleen Fox's work focuses on issues of memory, dream and the object, and was installed in a space that was once Sigmund Freud's bedroom, drawing on his collection to create an environment for a dialogue between conscious and unconscious space.

The process of securing, developing and funding the project is a second set of narratives to add to the theoretical ideas underpinning the work. Surreal House, on the other hand, was a major international exhibition exploring the intersections between surrealism and architecture, an area that relates closely to Krzysztof's own research and practice interests, and resulted in this case in a chapter for the exhibition catalogue.
