The trial of William Tuck provides a unique, enriching learning experience for Key Stage 2, 3 and 4 students

- Complementing the History, Citizenship, English and Drama curricula.

This innovative session includes:

- Exploring the theme of Crime and Punishment in the Victorian and modern day periods.
- Finding out about William Tuck, an 8 year old boy who appeared on trial in the Guildhall's Assembly Chamber Court in 1839.
- Role playing Tuck's trial in the Assembly Chamber Court and deciding upon an appropriate sentence for him, before discovering his real sentence.
- Going behind-the-scenes at the Guildhall to see the old policecells where Tuck was held.
