Course Context/Audience:

This is a practical half-day course for teachers who want to learn more about Gamelan music through playing the Gamelan and who want to be able to take some children to use the Gamelan. Delegates are required to remove footwear and should consider wearing loose clothing. They will be sitting on the floor for most of the session. It is particularly appropriate for teaching strands of the primary national curriculum and the new secondary curriculum for music (e.g. performance activities beyond the classroom, music from different cultures, global dimension, non-stave notation, contextual influences and development of music leadership skills. Once you are a trained Gamelanuser, access to the Gamelan, (with your pupils) is free. A gamelan booklet will be available to each delegate.

Objectives:

During the course you will

- · learn about Gamelan music, its principles and conventions
- · learn the relevance of Gamelan music in the music curriculum
- · train to take a group of children to play the Gamelan
- experience a musical activity that specifically contributes to the Excellence and Enjoyment themes about innovation, excellent primary teaching, the power of collaboration, partnership beyond the classroom; and at secondary level: learning, achievement, confidence, engagement and enjoyment.
- · realise how Gamelan music contributes to Children's Services' outcomes for KS1 and 2 and the foundation years concerning their ability to develop secure—relations, be eager, excited, curious and engaged in learning, have a sense of self-confidence and be able to co-operate and communicate effectively.
