We can also take free assemblies for schools within a 10 mile radius of Norwich.

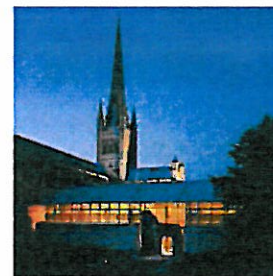
