### **Dereham Festival May 2012**

Household names including Paul Daniels and Blake, the latter featuring Norfolk's Humphrey Berney, are amongst the headline acts set to appear at the 2012 Dereham Festival which starts next Month (May 19<sup>th</sup> 2012) and lasts until 16<sup>th</sup> June.Other major acts confirmed to appear include the City of London Sinfonia, Elio Pace and concert pianist Warren Mailley-Smith who frequently plays for the Royal Family. Most of the 16 headline acts will perform at the 300 seat Dereham Memorial Hall which has undergone a £2.5m renovation.

25 local groups are also organising community events, many free of charge, which will take place at venues across the town including at the Memorial Hall and Assembly Rooms over the four week festival period.

Norfolk's American Connections Project - financial support for projects

The brand-new Norfolk's American Connections project, being run by Norfolk County Council Cultural Services and partners, celebrates Norfolk's many shared links with North America over 400 hundred years. The project provides an excellent opportunity to discover more about fascinating people and places, such as the 17<sup>th</sup> century Pilgrim Fathers, many of whom emigrated from Norfolk to America, 19th century migration from Norfolk to America, Abraham Lincoln's family ties to Norfolk, Thomas Paine, the Salem Witch Trials, and the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 'Friendly Invasion' which saw, at any one time, around 50,000 United States 8<sup>th</sup> Army Air Force (USAAF) personnel stationed in the county. The project's superb events programme commences on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July and runs until Thanksgiving Day in November. Highlights include:

- An exhibition in the Long Gallery at The Archive Centre (6 July 29 September) with an accompanying series of lunch time talks and children's activities.
- A "Connecting People" touring exhibition, produced with young people
  who are researching famous and not so famous American people and
  their links with Norfolk, which is available to hire for free by libraries,
  schools, community groups and venues across the county from July until
  November.
- A series of American-themed community led events.
- The Garage film project, which will see young people creating a film to tour community venues and a heritage inspired public performance.
- 'Across the Pond': South Norfolk American Film Festival September 2012
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Air Division Memorial Library Autumn Lecture Series 2012 4 public lectures exploring cultural links between Norfolk and North America.

The project, which has received just under £50,000 from the Heritage Lottery Fund, is being delivered by Norfolk Libraries, Record Office and Museums Service, South Norfolk Council, The Garage in Norwich, as well as community organisations across Norfolk.

We would like to invite groups and organisations to apply for a financial support of between £50 and £250 to deliver an event or activity which celebrates Norfolk's rich historical links with North America.

Please find attached an application form. The criteria for the grants are as follows. Projects must meet at least **one** of the criteria:

- To provide residents of and visitors to Norfolk with the opportunity to experience, understand and learn more about the long-standing cultural and historical links between Norfolk and North America, and how these have shaped communities on both sides of the Atlantic.
- To engage with local schools in projects to learn about historical connections with North America
- To involve groups who do not normally engage with heritage (especially 16-24 year olds) to take an active part and learn more about their cultural heritage through a programme of participatory and learning events.
- To celebrate historical connections including the 70th anniversary of the 'Friendly Invasion', when the United States 8th Air Force arrived in Norfolk, and the enormous impact this had on the local community and landscape

The funding can pay for almost anything except core staff costs e.g. materials and equipment, travel and expenses, freelancer costs, venue hire and marketing. Funding applications are assessed on a monthly basis. The charity is particular keen to support smaller organisations which might otherwise find it difficult to gain funding. Since its inception in 2004, it has made grants to a wide range of charitable organisations nationwide in England and Wales. ### **Village SOS Re-Opens for Funding (UK)**

The Big Lottery Fund has announced a new round of Village SOS funding - totalling £4million - to support rural community enterprises across the UK. Through Village SOS grants of between £10,000 and £50,000 will be available for projects in rural villages or small rural towns with fewer than 3,000 people. Organisations that can apply for funding include Voluntary and community groups or organisations as well as parish, town or community councils, provided local residents have clearly shaped the project. Examples of the type of projects supported through the previous Village SOS funding round include:

- The Barford and Wramplingham Community Shop, South Norfolk, which received a grant of £29,980 to set up and run a community shop which will be based in leased premises of the newly re-opened village pub.
- Laneshaw Bridge Community Enterprise in Pendle who received a grant
  of £29,066 to create a community hub, including a village shop, tearoom,
  post office outreach service and internet cafe. This enterprise will sustain
  itself from the income generated from the services provided and reinvest
  this back into community projects.

Communities that have already received funding from Village SOS should not apply for funding during this round. Applications should be submitted against one of three assessment rounds with the final deadline being 2pm on the 12th September 2012. For information visit:

### Heritage Lottery Fund Launches New Small Grants Programme (UK)

The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) has announced the launch of a new £1million small grants programme for people to get involved in their heritage. Called "All Our Stories", the programme will provide grants of £3,000 - £10,000 to support charities, community groups and heritage organisations running local history projects. The types of activities that can be supported include:

- Visits to places like historic buildings, landscapes, parks, burial grounds, museums, archaeological sites or industrial heritage sites like railways.
- Using collections like archives, libraries and museums, including collections held by people in the community.
- Talking to people who know about heritage or holding workshops, talks and sessions exploring people's memories.
- · Recording things like people's memories or local wildlife.
- Scanning old photographs and documents; archaeological digs or surveying historic buildings.

To be eligible for funding organisations will need to share what has been learnt by holding or producing things like:

- Community events
- Digital things like smart phone apps, DVDs or websites
- Display boards
- Exhibitions
- Guides/trails
- · Leaflets or books
- Packs for schools
- Performances.
