A North Norfolk beach is to be the location for one of the most stunning and spectacular events in the Cultural Olympiad and London 2012 Festival to celebrate the London 2012 Games.

To be performed at Holkham Beach, **Out of Water** has been specially commissioned for the festival and created by performing and visual artists Helen Paris and Caroline Wright to celebrate the London 2012 Games. A combination of visuals and music, it features a new score from acclaimed composer Jocelyn Pook and the solo voice of Laura Wright (Caroline's daughter), Britain's most exciting new soprano whose eagerly anticipated new album Glorious is released on 21 May.

At 8am for three mornings in August (25 - 27) a large group of singers and swimmers drawn from across Norfolk will strike out towards the water's edge until they span the wide expanse of beach. An audience of 100 will don wireless headphones and experience stories of endeavour, of swimming, of sinking, interweaved with haunting music, lifeguard drills, calls for help and struggles for breath.

Community Radio Fund (UK)

Telecom's Regulator Ofcom, has announced that the Community Radio Fund is now open for applications. Under the fund, Community Radio Stations can apply for funding to support their core running costs. These can include:

- Management costs
- Administration, financial management & reporting costs
- Fundraising to support the station
- Community outreach work
- Costs involved in using volunteers.

There is no upper limit of grant that can be applied for. There is no upper limit of grant that can be applied for, however applicants are asked to take note of previous grants awarded for an indication of realistic award figures. Grants can only be made to community radio licensees which are broadcasting under a community radio licence (and not an RSL, for example). The average grant awarded over the last few years has been in the region if £15,000.

Artists' international development fund opens for applications

A joint three-year programme between the British Council and Arts Council England which will support individual artists based in England to work internationally is now open for applications. The Artists' international development fund will provide grants of between £1,000 to £5,000 for artists to travel, explore and collaborate internationally while carrying out professional projects. The £750,000 fund aims to support artists who have carried out little or no work internationally, and is designed to help artists build on their domestic success and develop markets and audiences overseas for their work. Arts Council England and the British Council are each providing half of the total funding available. All projects must include one or two periods spent working abroad by the artist.

There are three funding rounds in each financial year the programme will run. The deadline for applications to be received for the first funding round this year is **31 May 2012**. The fund will be managed by the Arts Council. Successful applicants will be chosen jointly by Arts Council England and the British Council. The grants are to be used towards covering travel costs, daily needs, some material costs, and accommodation. For more information, and to apply, visit www.artscouncil.org.uk

Funding To Support Poetry and Literature Initiatives (UK)

The Clore Duffield Foundation has launched a new £1 million programme to fund poetry and literature initiatives for children and young people across the UK. The programme is due to run from 2011 to 2015 with two funding rounds a year. The programme is open to schools, FE colleges, community groups, libraries and other arts/cultural organisations. Grants of between £1,000 and £10,000 are available to support participatory learning projects and programmes focused on literature, poetry and creative writing for under 19s.

Funding for Volunteers to Improve their Community (England & Scotland)

vInspired, the Volunteering Charity, has announced that its Cashpoint grants scheme is once again open for applications. Ideas Fund Innovators - New Round Open to Applications

A new deadline has been announced for the Ideas Fund Innovators scheme, sponsored by IdeasTap.
