What the Students will Learn/Experiance.

This 10 day Summer School for Year 6 students transferring to Year 7 has been created to focus upon team building and communication skills. We aim to support young people to develop their self-esteem and confidence through working with them in the outdoor classroom. The 10 days will include extended periods of activity in Holt Hall's beautiful grounds where participants would have an opportunity to cook outside, light fires and build shelters. There will be a series of activities to explore some basic ecology and habitats such as freshwater and coastal environments. Participants would also work with our experienced practitioners to explore sustainability at Holt Hall and beyond. Green Horizons aims to bring out the best in young people, offer them opportunities to succeed, help them broaden their horizons and enable them to be more active global citizens.
