Heritage Lottery Fund new small grants programme Deadline: 31 July 2012

The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) has announced the launch of a new £1 million small grants programme for people to get involved in their heritage. Called 'All Our Stories', the programme will provide grants of £3,000 to £10,000 to support charities, community groups and heritage organisations running local history projects. The types of activities that can be supported include:

- visits to places like historic buildings, landscapes, parks, burial grounds, museums, archaeological sites or industrial heritage sites like railways;
- using collections like archives, libraries and museums, including collections held by people in the community;
- talking to people who know about heritage or holding workshops, talks and sessions exploring people's memories;
- recording things like people's memories or local wildlife;
- · scanning old photographs and documents;
- archaeological digs or surveying historic buildings.

To be eligible for funding organisations will need to share what has been learnt by holding or producing things like:

- community events;
- digital things like smart phone apps, DVDs or websites;
- display boards;
- exhibitions;
- guides/trails;
- leaflets or books;
- · packs for schools;
- performances.

Greggs Foundation Breakfast Club Grants (England, Scotland & Wales)

The Greggs Foundation breakfast club programme supports young people of primary school age who live in disadvantaged areas of the UK. The Greggs Foundation currently supports 180 breakfast clubs throughout England, Scotland and Wales. Schools that are interested in opening a breakfast club at your school must be able to show that at least 40% of your pupils qualify for free school meals and that the school serves a disadvantaged community. School should able to attract adult volunteers to help run the scheme and attendance at the club must be free for all pupils. The grant can even be used for games and sports equipment to help children play together. Greggs also provides bread donations from the nearest shop.

Recently set up breakfast clubs include:

- Clubs at Hillside Community Primary School, in Skelmersdale which received funding of £600 for its breakfast club which around 45 young people attend each day.
- Swalwell Primary School, in Gateshead where nearly 50% of school children are entitle to free meals received a grant of £1,100.

Funding for IT Projects Supporting Disadvantaged Groups (UK)

Funding is available to organisations with innovative IT related project ideas that can make a positive difference to disadvantaged and vulnerable groups - in the UK, developing countries and around the world. The funding is available through the Nominet Trust. The aim of the Trust is to fund innovative Internet projects that make a positive difference to the lives of disadvantaged and vulnerable people, primarily in terms of education, safety and inclusion. The Trust is particularly interested in funding projects that can be scaled up and replicated. There is no minimum grant application and applications for over £100,000 require an interview. Organisations wishing to apply need initially to complete and online eligibility questionnaire. Those organisations deemed successful will be provided with a link to a more detailed application form.

Funding to Regenerate Town Centres (England)

The Government has announced a second funding round to find a further 12 pilot areas under the Portas Plus initiative. Under the Portas Plus initiatives struggling towns and cities across England are given the chance to bid for about £100,000 each to breathe new life into their ailing high streets. The funding will be available to those towns that come up with the best High Street blueprints in a move that fulfils the first and last recommendations of Mary Portas' High Streets Review, commissioned by the Prime Minister and published before Christmas. The second round of applications is open until 30 June 2012.

The Government has also announced a £1million Future High Street X-Fund, which will be awarded to areas with the most creative and effective schemes to rejuvenate their town centres; a National Markets Day, launching a National Markets Fortnight, to celebrate the role markets can play and offer budding entrepreneurs the chance to test their business ideas; and a £500,000 fund for Business Improvement Districts, to help town centres access loans for their set-up costs. Music Grants for Older People (England & Wales)

The registered charity, Concertina which makes grants to charitable bodies which provide musical entertainment and related activities for the elderly has announced that the next deadline for applications is the 31st October 2012. Social Entrepreneurs Programme (UK)

The School for Social Entrepreneurs has announced that it is offering places on a learning programme, with grants, for social entrepreneurs or would-be social entrepreneurs to make their ideas a reality, or to scale up their existing projects. The scheme is funded by Lloyds Banking Group, with additional support from Nominet Trust, and will run across the UK for the next five years. The programme has two strands:

- The Start Up Programme compromises of a grant of £4,000 and a place on SSE's Start Up learning programme. It is for applicants at an early stage in the development of their project or organisation, and supports personal development and business skills development to help turn projects or project ideas into reality.
- The Scale Up Programme compromises of a grant of £15,000 and a place on SSE's Scale Up learning programme. The programme is for social entrepreneurs with an established organisation who are looking to take it to the next level, equipping them with the tools to develop it further and maximise their social impact.

Gregg Foundation Regional Grants (England, Scotland & Wales)

Local Not for Profit Organisations with a turnover of £500,000 or less per year can apply for grants of up to £2,000 through the Greggs Foundation regional grants programme. The regional grants programme is administered by committees of volunteers from Gregg shops, bakeries and offices who are based in England, Scotland and Wales. They use their knowledge of the local area to make small grants to local organisations, in particular those that make a difference to people in need in the heart of Greggs' local communities. The Greggs Foundation prioritises local organisations that help people in need in their local area. Although each application is considered on its merits, the Greggs Foundation is highly unlikely to fund an application that doesn't work in a highly disadvantaged area or support priority beneficiaries, these are:

Theatre Protection Fund Small Grants Scheme Open for Applications (UK)

The Theatres Trust, which works with commercial, public and voluntary sectors to secure a sustainable future for theatre buildings, has announced that it is now accepting applications through its Theatre Protection Fund Small Grants Scheme. Through the scheme, theatres run by charities and not-for-profit groups can apply for grants of up to £5,000 in order to carry out capital improvements to enhance their work within the local community. The types of works that can be funded include:

- Urgent building repairs
- Environmental improvements
- Works to enhance physical accessibility, etc.

Applicants have to own or manage theatres with titles or signed leases of more than 5 years on buildings in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. Applicants also need to demonstrate that they run a regular theatre programme of professional, community and/or amateur work presenting no less than 30 performances a year.

Young Film Fund (UK)

First Light Movies provides grants to projects that enable young people to participate in all aspects of film productions. The funding is available to organisations such as schools, youth services, community and voluntary groups that work with young people aged between 5 and 18. The Studio Awards provides grants of up to £30, 000 for between two and four films of up to 10 minutes; the Pilot Awards provides grants of up to £5,000 for one short film of up to five minutes in duration; and the 90 seconds Comedy Shorts which provides grants of up to £20,000 to support between three and six short comedy genre films each up to 90 Seconds in duration.

Previous grants awarded included:

- Hartside Primary School, County Durham, which received a grant of £3,000 to help produce a five minute shadow puppet film using an original fairy tale devised, told and filmed by the children in Year 1.
- Balfour Junior School in Brighton, which received funding to make an environmental documentary 'The Amazing Adventures of the Plastic Bag'.

Big Society Capital will have £600million, of which the majority comes from unused cash in bank accounts that had been dormant for more than 15 years. The fund will back social enterprises that prove they can repay an investment through the income they generate. It will seek to connect social organisations to financial markets and to revolutionise the funding alternatives available to them. Most importantly it will provide new investment capital specifically focused on improving lives and supporting communities around the country.

The fund has already agreed investments worth £3.6m in a number of schemes including:

Think Forward Social Impact, which helps young people into work and education Franchising Works, which trains the unemployed how to run a franchise business Community Generation Fund, which supports the development of renewable energy infrastructure, such as solar panels and biomass boilers, for local communities. 


