Heritage Lottery Fund new small grants programme Deadline: 31 July 2012

The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) has announced the launch of a new £1 million small grants programme for people to get involved in their heritage. Called 'All Our Stories', the programme will provide grants of £3,000 to £10,000 to support charities, community groups and heritage organisations running local history projects. The types of activities that can be supported include:

- visits to places like historic buildings, landscapes, parks, burial grounds, museums, archaeological sites or industrial heritage sites like railways;
- using collections like archives, libraries and museums, including collections held by people in the community;
- talking to people who know about heritage or holding workshops, talks and sessions exploring people's memories;
- recording things like people's memories or local wildlife;
- scanning old photographs and documents;
- archaeological digs or surveying historic buildings.
- To be eligible for funding organisations will need to share what has been learnt by holding or producing things like:
- community events;
- digital things like smart phone apps, DVDs or websites;
- display boards;
- exhibitions;
- guides/trails;
- · leaflets or books;
- packs for schools;
- performances.

Facilities and space for your stall/activity are made available to you on the following conditions:

1. Health and Safety

You must comply with all relevant requirements of health and safety legislation (including Regulations).

We reserve the right to decline your booking if we have concern over the content or risk involved in your stand/activity.

You must notify the organisers if there are any other risks that might result from your stall/activity so we can complete a risk assessment.

2. Fire Regulations

You must observe and comply with all fire regulations and any directions given to you by our fire safety officer or the Fire Service.

3. Insurance

We recommend that you have public liability insurance to the value of £5,000,000.

4. Damage

You must not cause any damage to the site or facilities and if any damage does occur you must put this right at your own expense as soon as possible.

5. Loss

We will not be held responsible for the loss of any of your possessions, goods or other objects while you are on site.

6. Electrical Appliances

All portable electrical appliances you bring on to the site must be fit for the purpose and have valid Portable Appliance Test certificates.

If using a generator, please confirm safety precautions will be in place to address risks from electricity, storage of fuel and fumes.

We will not allow an electrical supply to be taken out of the buildings without prior arrangement and where we do grant permission for such access, you must ensure that all external electrical supplies are adequately protected against weather conditions, impact damage and meet British Standards. Arrangements must be made to ensure suitable earthing and all external supplies and equipment should be checked by a competent electrician.
