## Treasures of China Exhibition Colchester Castle Opens to the public on Saturday 30 June 2012

The international Treasures of China exhibition opens at Colchester Castle on Saturday 30 June 2012. It will showcase seventy treasures from Nanjing Museum, the second largest museum in China.

Visitors will be able to explore the rise of Imperial China from the earliest Stone Age tombs to the time of the last Emperor as they let us them on a journey through 4500 years of Chinese history.

Stunning objects include a 2000 year old, life size jade suit from the tombs of the Han Dynasty rulers, an exquisite gold cicada sitting on a jade leaf worn by a Ming Princess nearly 600 years ago and the luxury items and ornaments that adorned the palace of the last of the Imperial families as the tumult of the twentieth century changed China forever.

Alongside this rich history we are celebrating Chinese crafts and the enduring appeal of animals in Chinese culture.

Tim Young, Portfolio Holder for Planning, Community Safety & Culture for Colchester Borough Council said, "This exhibition will provide visitors to Colchester a genuine, once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience these fascinating objects which have never been seen before anywhere in the UK and Colchester Castle will be the only place visitors can experience them before they go back to China in January 2013."
